A WEEK IN FLORENCE

Indo - Italian meeting

Rich in natural resources and ancient profound cultures, India, one of the BRIC countries, new leading poles of the global development, is going through a phase of great expansion, with new chances to successfully address persistent poverty and urban decay too.

On different sides expertise in Italian universities, the Florence one in particular, can find challenging opportunities for collaboration, if supported by qualified exchanges at various levels.

This initiative, A Week in Florence. Indo-Italian Meeting - open to students, researchers, professors and people interested in Indian culture and society - operates in this direction, aimed at broadening and strengthening relations between the universities and, more generally, between various cultural and economic dynamic sectors of the cities involved.

The "Week" has been organized by the LabPSM of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning, thanks to the MoUs with the two Indian universities and **Cooperlink funds coming from Ministry of Education,** University and Researche. It represents a central moment of confrontation with the School of Architecture of Jadavpur University in Kolkata and the School of Planning and Architecture in New Delhi, in continuity with numerous common activities undertaken since 2008: bachelor theses and PhD co-supervision, mobility Cooperlink Program, events in collaboration with the Embassy of Italy in India, mutual visiting Indians and Italian professors giving lectures, seminars at master and phd courses, etc. The aim is to enable: Indian guests to get in touch, as well as with the Florentine academic world, with diverse realities of our city and region; the Italian partners to know the high level of urban and regional studies carried out in two of the most prestigious Indian universities. The realistic hope is the take off of new joint training, research and international cooperation projects.


